

The best beaches

Es trenc

Directions: drive through Campos following the signs for Santanyí. Immediately after leaving Campos there is a sign on the right that indicates Es Trenc.

It is the longest virgin beach on the island at 3.5 kilometers long and 60 meters wide.



Formentor

Directions: You can get there by boat from the port of Pollensa or by car (we recommend making stops along the way to enjoy the views).

In summer the road is closed, it can only be accessed by bus. Beautiful narrow beach, on the Formentor península.



Cala Mesquida

Directions: you can go along the Capdepera regional road or on foot from Cala Agulla beach, through the pine forest, always following the marked path.

Fine sand, a watchtower on top of a hill has views over the entire beach and the urbanized end.



Playa de Muro

Directions: continuation of the Puerto Alcúdia beach in the direction of Can Picafort. Its waters are calm, crystal clear and shallow.



Cala Mondragó

Directions: it is a beautiful beach with fine white sand located within the Mondragó Natural Park, near Santanyí in the south of the island. Next to it we find the path by the sea that takes us to the beach of S'Amarador.



Illetas

Directions: about 10 km away from Palma, in the community of Calvià, between Portals Nous and Cala Mayor.

It is the longest of the three small beaches that make up the town of Illetas.



Camp de Mar

Directions: it is four kilometers from Andratx, located between Platja de ses Dones and the imposing Cap Andritxol. A charming wooden bridge connects the beach to La Illeta, a small restaurant located on a rock about 20 meters from the beach itself.



Cala Estellencs

Directions: Located in the municipality with which it shares its name, Estellencs, 21 km from Andratx; near the Puig de Galatzó. Quiet pebble beach perfect for snorkeling.



Cala Deià

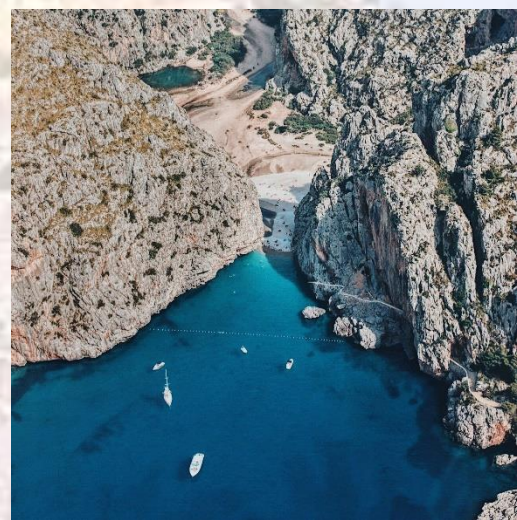
Directions: located near the town of Deià, in the heart of the Serra de Tramuntana, northwest of Mallorca. Cala de Roca and has two restaurants, both with good quality food, including fish, paella, tapas and the like.



Sa Calobra

Directions: to get there it has a 14-kilometer route (MA-2141) full of tight and linked curves, over cut cliffs. If you wish, you can arrive by bus, boat (departure from Soller) or with your own vehicle.

La Cala del Torrent de Pareis - sa Calobra, is a gravel rock beach that makes its way between a huge mountain.



Es cargol

Directions: get to the Ses Salines lighthouse and park on the road. Walk until you reach the sea and turn right (facing the sea) After walking 30 min you will reach the beach.
